You have no need to go anywhere- journey within yourself

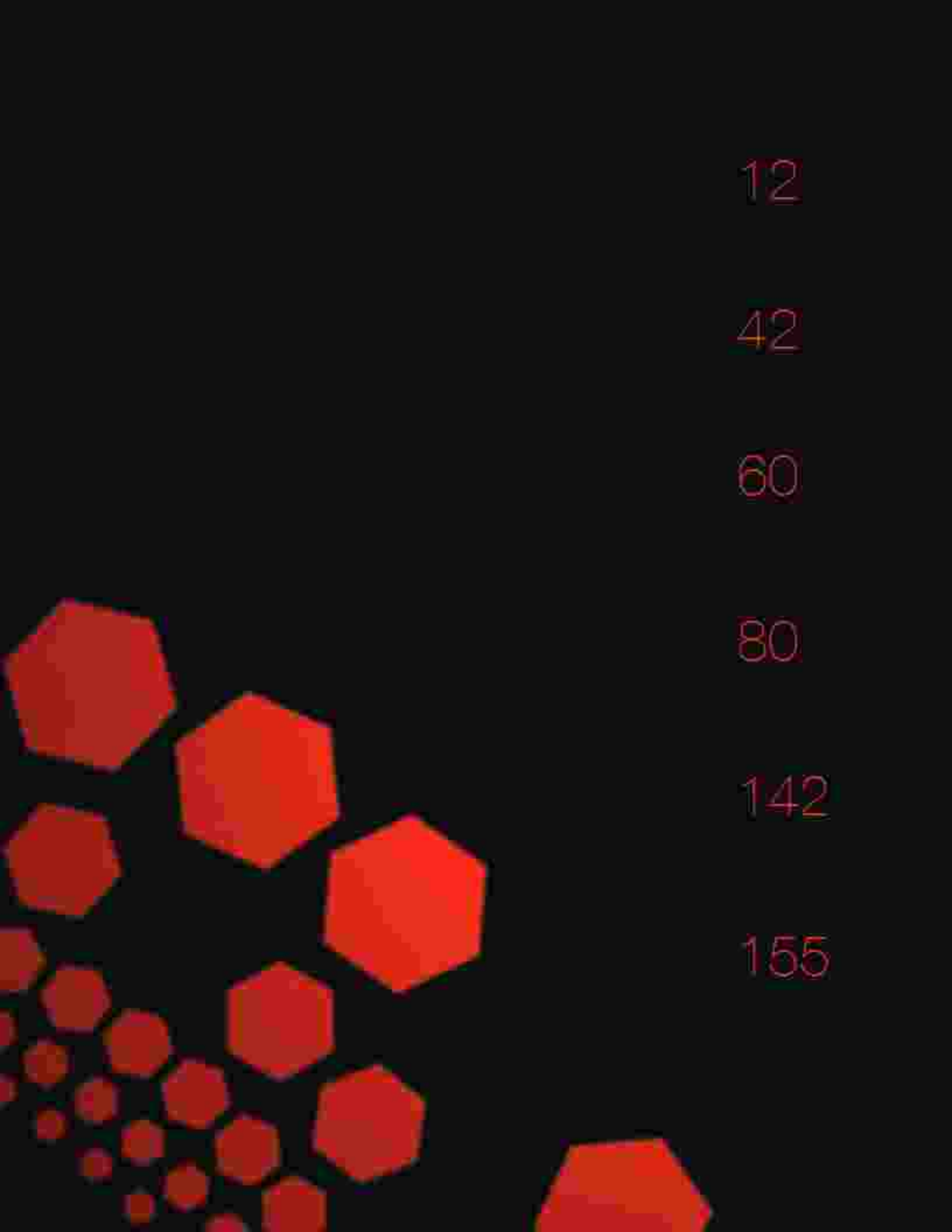

Admission

The admission to our B.Tech. Program is purely on the basis of rank obtained in the Entrance Examination conducted by Amrita University on all India basis. The exam was conducted at 78 Cities in 122 Centres. More than 30,000 candidates appeared for B.Tech. Entrance Exam. in 2012.

To M.Tech., we give direct admission to GATE candidates. For others, the admission is based on academic performance and interview. For MCA, the admission is based on the rank obtained in the Entrance Test conducted by us followed by interview and academic performance in the qualifying degree exam.

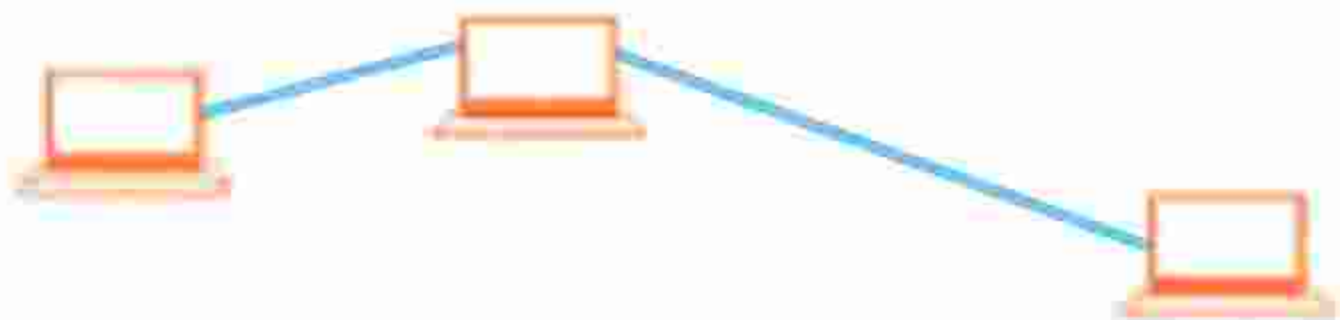

The institution is gradually moving towards a fully residential type. We have a total of 8 hostels in the campus - 6 for boys and 2 for girls, accommodating nearly 5000 students. Ninety percent of the students live in the hostels. We are adding accommodation for more and more inmates every year.

I would like to place on record that we have three plants for waste water treatment and re-use. The entire waste water after treatment is used for irrigation and the solid waste as manure. We also separate plastics, metals and food waste at the source itself and prepare it for recycling.

- A swimming pool of category-1 of Olympic size (50x25M), together with gallery for 100 people, shower, change rooms and cloak rooms are provided. 2.5 Million litres of water is filtered in six hours by pressure sane filter method
- In our 350+ acre campus there is a sports ground with a 400m track, separate courts for basket ball, volley ball, badminton, tennis and two separate well equipped gymnasia for boys and girls.
- A synthetic Shuttle badminton court and a new gym with state of the art facilities
- Construction of two additional Football fields, 400 Mts. International Standard Athletic Track with Gallery, Separate Indoor Area and Basketball Court for girls are nearing completion.

Faculty & Staff

We have 344 plus members of teaching faculty and a matching number of non-teaching staff. This is well over the numbers as per AICTE norms that brings our teacher student ratio to 1:12. In addition to these, staff required for security, transport, maintenance, gardening and similar centralized facilities are provided by the Ashram.

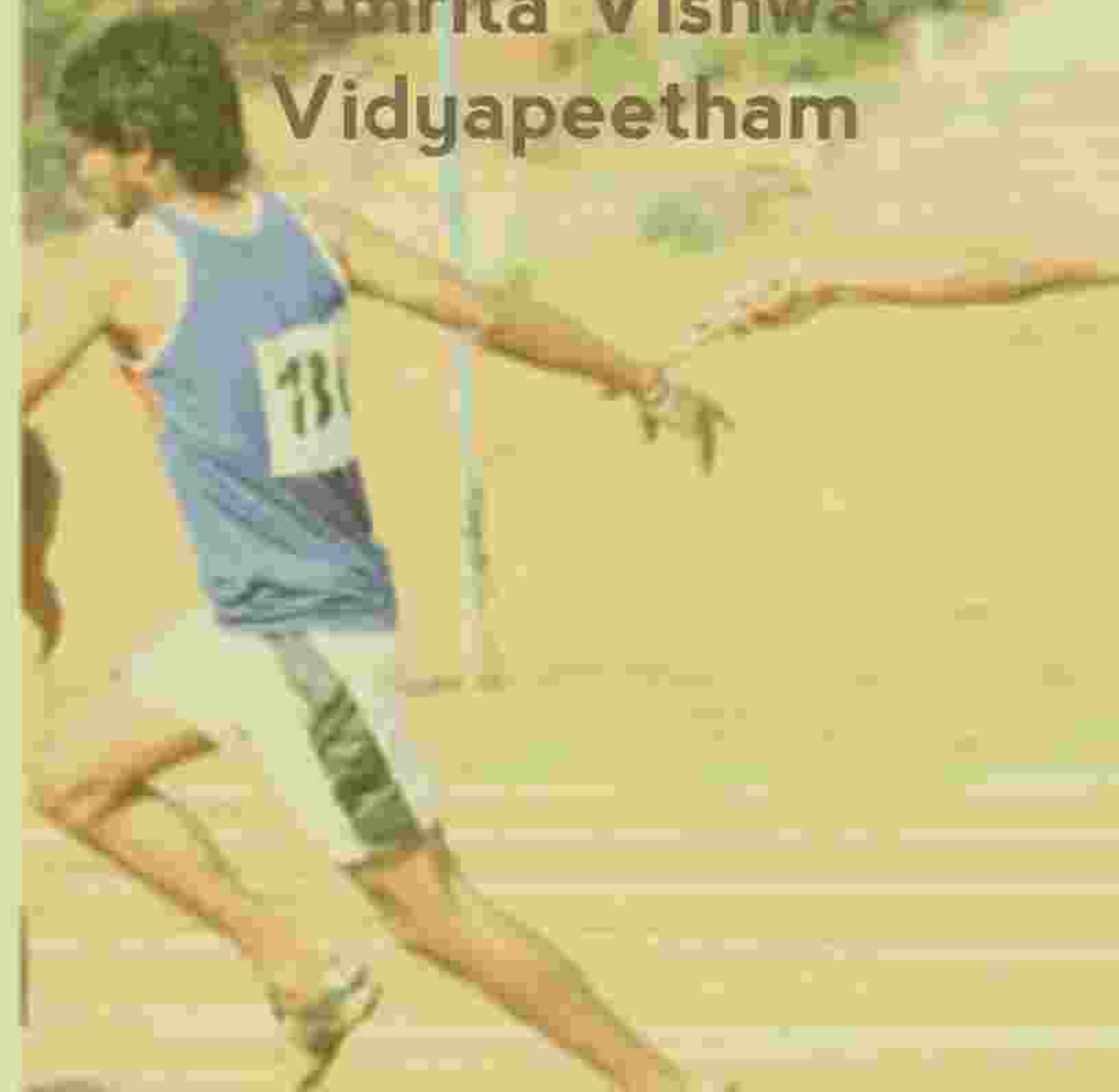
AMRITOTSAVAM

Daggubati Purandareswari, Honorable Chief Guest of the ninth convocation ceremony of Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, gave an inspiring speech to the vast contingent of graduates waiting to receive their certificates, through video. After a brief apology for not being able to make it for the function, she congratulated the graduating students and their parents who worked tirelessly for years to see the light of this day. Stressing on the fact that Amrita University has always been providing quality education to children living even in the remotest areas, she commended its remarkable growth from a meager strength of 120 students to 17000 students at present.

The Government of India has always focused on imparting quality education to each and every student of the country and Smt. Purandareswari acknowledged Amrita's contribution in this regard. She said that education is not only a goal in itself but a powerful driving force in socio-economic change so when such education is combined with sound macroeconomic policies it becomes the foundation for globally competent economies as well as for democratic societies. She also stressed that the generation and propagation of new thoughts and its proper use is very important for the growth of any nation in the world today. Citing the inclusion of five education related parameters in the total list of nine laid down by the World Economic Forum to assess the sustainability of economies across the globe, she underlined the growing importance that nations are attributing to education today.

It is said that the 21st century is a knowledge century so it's necessary for the people to accept the fact that knowledge and brainpower must reflect in the country's advancements, competitiveness as well as its human capital. Human capital is the investment that is made in the well being of our human resource and there is no better investment to make other than education in the well being of human capital. Going back in history Smt. Purandeswari reminisced that India had not more than 20 universities, 500 institutions, about 1500 teaching faculty and about 1% gross enrollment ratio in higher education institutions. But today we have around 600+ universities and 31000+ institutions, a 500000-600000 strong teaching faculty and a 18-19 % gross enrollment ratio.

She continues by saying that India is a diverse nation and is not a country of herself rather a country within country. So overcoming the diversity that exists in our country and ensuring that quality education is imparted to each and every child is a herculean task; which speaks of the resolve that Government has shown in the same. However she asked the people to remain cautious and not become complacent because our gross enrollment ratio compared to other European and American countries is very low. They have around 40-70% while we have only 18-19% which is a major factor in sustainable economy for a country. She admitted that India has a long road to cover to reach the higher level of gross enrollment ratio and literacy. For that she gave a solution which is to introspect and find out what we would gain by making education available to the children. Governments throughout our history have emphasized that accessibility, equity and quality are the cornerstones of the education sector in our country. Reiterating the general consensus of many international surveys that nothing can stop India from becoming a superpower she said that our country has islands of excellence but unfortunately in a sea of underdevelopment.

Therefore India needs a future generation who will help her emerge as a great power of the 21st century. She emphasized the importance of leaders who can take the reins of the country at every stage. As the old saying goes leaders don't do different things but they do things differently, similarly the future generation also should do things differently to take our country in rightful positions 'which is right on top of the committee of nations.'

The next great challenge that she mentioned is innovation. She said that it's important to convert India from a land of ideas to a land of opportunities. Taking the example of the 'Indica' car which was sold to the British, she said it was possible due to the flexible policies of the Government and the helping hand of the corporate. She stated that institutions, governments, students and the corporate should work together to ensure that our Indian intellect will be given that type of opportunity where it will help them to emerge leaders and would help them to support our country when she is in her transitional phase. With a huge population, a sustained growth rate of 6-7% and a very strong democratic society India has every chance of becoming a superpower of the 21st century.

Quoting Chanakya from Arthashastra she said that 'the eldest in the family is respected in the house, the village head is respected in the village, the king is revered in the kingdom but an educated person is respected everywhere he goes'. Therefore India needs that fraternity of students from Amrita University who would be respected everywhere wherever they go. Smt. Purandeswari expressed confidence that the graduates who were to receive the certificates would help India realize her dream. She ultimately signed off by quoting the famous lines of the poet, Iqbal, that says- 'Saare Jahan Se Acha, Hindustan Hamaara.'

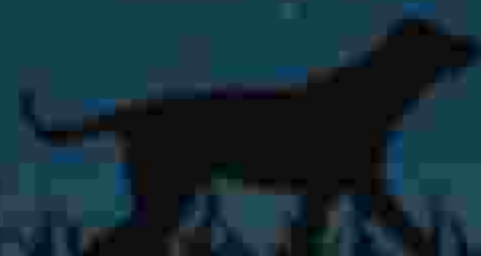

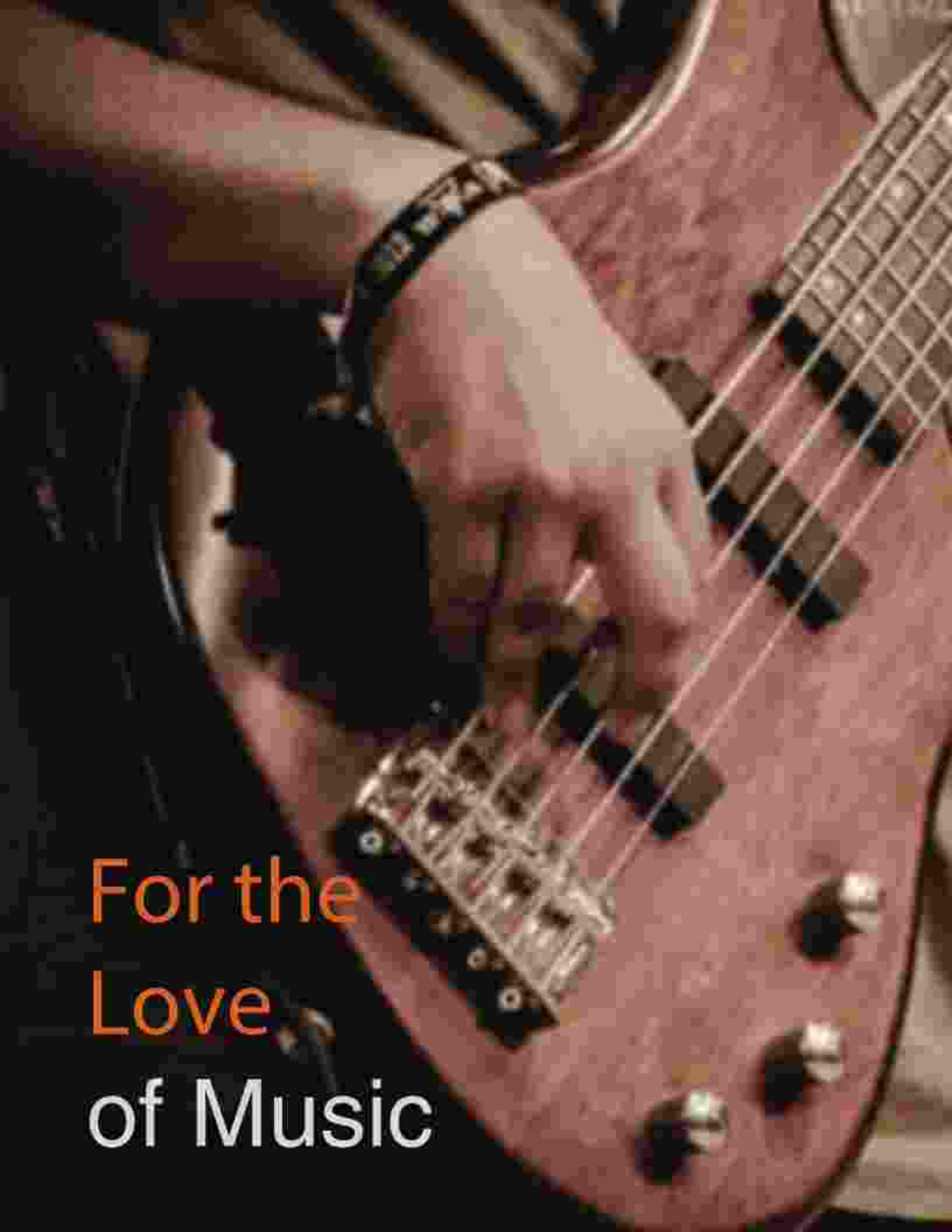

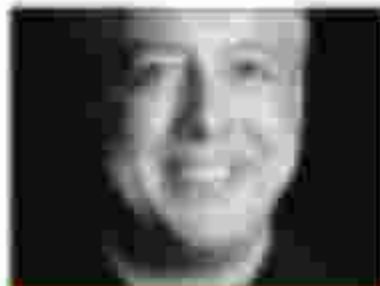

“...Ranjana Kumari of the Centre for Social Research, who is leading the programme, says the growing number of rapes and the low conviction rates have left women feeling unprotected, while many men see themselves as beyond the law: only 28 per cent of rape cases and 20 per cent of cruelty cases against husbands are followed by convictions. “There is no fear of being punished,” she says. “Because of the [police] approach, it is not considered serious crime. That’s why they need a lot more sensitivity, to see it as a serious crime. Women report only one in 10 rapes, not only because of the policing, but also the huge social shame...”



“...The Indian constitution prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex, but the position of women remains unequal, according to a United Nations report. Women in India have long been subject to entrenched cultural biases that perpetuate the valuing of sons over daughters, who are often seen as an economic burden to families that fear high dowries and wedding costs, experts say...”



“...Our family lives contain elaborate formal and informal means of reinforcing and celebrating male privilege. Sons are brought up to both perpetuate and condone gender hierarchies and are nurtured with a sense of entitlement. It is this that lies at the heart of male violence towards women. Indian “family values” are contexts of a great deal of jingoistic celebrations about what is special about Indian society. Such jingoism keeps us from turning a critical eye towards what is genuinely rotten within one of the most basic units of social life. It keeps us from critically examining the masculine cultures that impact upon the relationship between genders...”

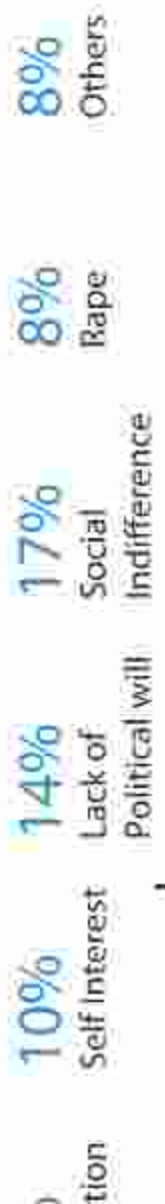

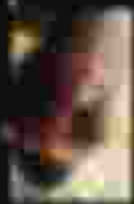

There you do. The 'oddities' meaning. This was what I thought it was all about too, until the summer of 2012 happened.

DAY 1, JUNE 2012

I board the Bus no. 5 and watch the city speed by. Mumbai. The place where I was born. The world saw it as a bustling cosmopolitan city with everyone leading hasty lives. You could dance with people all night here or spend it all alone behind your grey curtains. It was all up to you. This city could make you feel as lonely as ever possible or suffocate you with its milling crowds. You could drown in the noisy traffic jams or relax in the rhythmic coughs of dusty engines.

Choices. That's what this place was all about. That was what put the extra before the ordinary when describing this city. It allowed you to choose. You don't have to try and fit in because when you look, you already have. It's open to all. You could just walk in and she would look upon you with no visible lack of recognition. Beneath the haste, beneath all the lip gloss and cigarette smoke, within every home and tucked away in the corners of a chaat shop lie vulnerable and naked honesty and love. If you look for it, you will find it. It's like a painting; you can interpret it in a thousand ways. It was this volatility, this very freedom, this

ability to choose, blend and stand out at the same time that seduced me. Mumbai wasn't my city of dreams; it was the city that taught me to dream. The arched signboard in blue font laid on a white background didn't look very welcoming. For one, it was situated between roadside huts with semi naked people washing each other, washing plates, washing clothes and who knows what else using only one bucket of water. Not exactly your picturesque holiday get-away. Second, the tall rusted iron gates with spikes that didn't even leave for the slightest peek within. Here I was, already doubting whether I was meant for this.

I started out on 13th June 2012. The first boy I met was Raju Sheikh. Odd name? Yes, but oddities didn't end there. His dad was a Muslim businessman based in London. His Hindu mom was one of his seven wives. Unbelievable? I was in shock too. As if this wouldn't suffice, he had lost her to TB on June 6th. A week before I came. What hurt was that his father didn't even turn up for her funeral!

A few days later, he would show me her photo and I would realize the injustice done to her. She was good looking you ask? No. She was absolutely stunning. Never in my life had I seen a woman who had spent her life on the edge of poverty and yet manage to look as radiant and well groomed as her. And for such a lady who could mesmerize with just a snapshot, there was hardly even a proper funeral service. My heart was wrenched out and squeezed by the end of Day One.

Raju on the other hand gave me a ray of hope. His English was far better than one could've expected from a slum dwelling 8th grader. He spent his mornings reading the newspaper figuring out the meanings of new words and picking up grammatical phrases. Self education indeed! Conversation with him were slow as he was rather shy and refused to chatter on like the rest of the kids but the smile on his face never left.

But as fate would've had it, my time with him was short-lived. His school began on June 15th and he was in the morning session and I worked from 9-11 am. I couldn't and would not also see him for a long time to come...

The Shelter didn't have many rules except for each volunteer being allotted a few kids to teach daily and to write a log on what you did each day which would be signed and stamped by Father Jesu. My kids were Prakash and Jahangir. But by then I'd become friends with several others as well – Krishna, Karthik, Kumar, Govinda etc.

Early mornings began with the chorus of street children screaming "Good Morning DIDI!!!" and mid afternoons with Veg. paneer cheese rolls, orange slush and chocolate waffles to munch on from the nearby eateries while waiting for the bus to come and late evening spent by shaking a leg to the latest Bollywood chart toppers and cardio work outs at the Arts in Motion dance studio. An easy living no? Definitely not.

The transition isn't easy. You spend hours with under fed kids with broken families, looking for love, hardly being able to read alphabets who look up to you as though you are the only light in their dark tunnel of shunted lives and from there you think you can easily transform into your lycra suits with cool androids and jump to the beats of Chikni Chameli ?

No. It took me a week to adjust my conscience and my attitude. Once you are with them, you will never want to leave. Once you are out, trust me, you never want to go back and feel the pain. It takes immense strength for social workers out there to leave their comfy homes and soft, orderly lives daily to go back to seeing the rugged faces and empathizing with their heartbreaking stories.

Social service isn't meant for the kind hearted. It isn't meant for those who will feel bad looking at all the kids suffering and pray for a better world. It's for those who can walk on and lead their lives as it is and continue helping without it tampering the other side of their life. It's for those who can compartmentalize life and be detached. It's for those who can look ahead and think future rather than turn back and weep for the past. It was not for people like me. But yet again, I was proved wrong.

Prakash had absolutely ZERO interest in studying. All my coaxing and cooing to make him learn the 26 letters of the English language were in vain. Jahangir, in contrast, was the Newton of the lot. He had been in another NGO in Kolkata and had picked up enough good English for me to have a decent conversation with. Moreover, his speed and sharpness in Arithmetic left me stumped. The rest, I had to manage with my broken Hindi. I spent days confusing them and myself over "kharghosh" and "kachua". Tried to explain shade as "dhoop se bachane" and whatnot. It was hilarious for me as well as them but at the end of the day, I made my point and they? They taught me more than I could ever teach them.

One fine Monday morning, as the long hand edged closer to 12 on the clock and it was time to wrap up study time, Govinda brought up the topic of Satyamev Jayate.

"Didi, kya aap dekhte hain Satyamev Jayate?" "Not really....kyun? Aap dekhte ho?" "Haan, har Sunday! Brothers aur Fathers ke saath!" he grinned back.

"Kal ka episode domestic violence pe thana?" (I genuinely had no idea how to translate domestic violence in Hindi)

"Yes yes" joined in Jahangir after handing me his Arithmetic sums for correction.

(Note: Satyamev Jayate is an Indian talk show hosted by Bollywood actor and film maker Aamir Khan. It's a show that highlights social issues in our country by victims of such stigmas and injustices speaking on the show. It's come under severe criticism for commercialization as well as being pointless as there is nothing that one can do by simply talking and sympathizing for an hour every week)

But besides all that, it was heavily targeted by every other cynical and skeptical Indian. Complaints that the show was fake and all that it didn't serve any purpose was wrought in the media. The tweets mocking this show were never-ending. I'd given up thinking that changing the mindset of Indians would take more than an era. But little did I realize the value that the show was imparting to the lower classes.

Jahangir states "Ek aurat ko maarna nahi chahiye- Usko izzat karna bahut zaroori hai!" The other children nod in silent agreement. More than my alphabets and numbers, it's these values that will help them along in life. It was this small statement that would make a world of difference in their future. Coming from battered families where they have seen all kinds of abuse, morals and values like these when inculcated, will lead to a more educated India. A better education that even our dear Kapil Sibal could hope to provide. He gave me a tobacco stained smile as I looked at him lost in thought.

And my day was made. The world is a funny thing. It gives you hope and happiness but the next second it throws you face first into the dirt.

Prakash had stopped learning with me and I'd told Brother that he required special attention as I doubted that he was slightly dyslexic. Jahangir was nowhere in sight. I caught hold of one of the small kids and asked him to go to their dorm and call him. He wasn't there either. I almost started to worry when Father told that he'd gone for his medical checkup. So that was the day I got another set of kids- Govinda and Kumar.

Little did I know that I would recall the above line and smile ten days from now when I would bid goodbye to Govinda. Some attachments come over time; some come because of what you mean to each other and some just because it's meant to be. Mine and Govinda's bond fell into the second category. A dark skinny little bundle of naughtiness that he was! Refusing to learn from anyone and still hadn't learnt the basic alphabets....until I came along. I don't know if it was because I was genuinely keen on helping him, or whether I reminded him of someone in his past but we instantly hit off. I finished teaching the entire set of alphabets in less than 2 hours and he was proudly reciting to anyone who would give him an ear. Trust me; it's difficult to teach children when they have no willingness to learn

The next day he came and told me he'd practiced and recited it all over again and I gave him a Hi-5. We were inseparable after that.

July 2012

The medical trip was over and I finally went to see Jaganthi. He was one of the doctors and I was hoping I could do my best and stream him and a good career etc. But then all my very simple question came.

He had an idea. How? How? I immediately asked myself this question as I thought and looked at his that night. The situation and the fact that I was in a great position of justification given. I happened. Following up on me. A common thing it was for him, but for me it was another time. I had to come to terms with. As really not for Perbrook. Still. All the good things about the building of being up surrounding it.

July 2012

It was my final week at the Shelter and even the monsoon rains were dropping by once in awhile. A happy time playing around and teaching them out of this big picture encyclopedia I had bought for them. From galaxies to volcanoes, I told them all I could about the world outside the four walls of the cream colored building in Vadala.

Govinda had become exceedingly fond of me as we played games and I taught him numbers. For someone who once thought, he would never be able to read or write, I had given a chance. It was a feeling that both of us couldn't describe with mere words and this made it all the more difficult to break the news that I was leaving that Sunday. But when I did tell them, they didn't understand the implications till a few days before I actually left. Assuming my college was in Mumbai, they thought I would come every Sunday and spend time with them. I cringed within when I told them that I studied in Coimbatore and saw their faces fall. "When will you come back" was a question that was repeatedly asked but the silent question that never left their lips was "Will you come back?"

Govinda refused to talk much about it and was content in ignoring the whole affair. I decided I'd make my last day memorable and bought a huge chocolate cake for them. Govinda had earlier said "Don't spend too much on the cake okay?" I laughed and told him not to worry about such things.

Matidull was the cutest of the lot and he begged "Mat jao didi!" and it nearly broke my heart. But my lessons were far from over...

Even in the last few days, I realized what perseverance and courage meant. A random conversation with Nitesh brought up the fact that he was an orphan. "Papa diwali mein gaya aur mama holi mein" Those words stung. It wasn't the death but the occasion. A child who will have to spend two of North India's most festive celebrations in mourning. It was a cruel curse and all my faith in God crashed. Yet he asked me "College Diwali aur Christmas ke liye chutti dega na? Tho uss samay mein idhar aana" with a big smile and twinkle in his eyes.

I left the Shelter that day, a wounded soul.

The cake cutting was fun and the kids had their share. In fact, we had some left over pieces for the side staff as well. After clicking several photos, I bid them all goodbye. Most of them turned and ran away to play games. I walked away feeling wonderful and nurtured from within when a voice called out "DIDI!" I saw Govinda wave fervently from the windows. I waved back and turned the corner. He wasn't done yet though; he had found another window on the rear side of the building and startled me with another cry.

I looked around and spotted his orange tee between the leaves. I smiled and waved my blue umbrella at him. And I recalled the lines of Schopenhauer. It wasn't loss but it was a Good Bye and it taught me the weight of the word Didi. And as I sit typing out this long dreary word document that will probably get tucked away and be read by handful few, I realize once again that the world runs and will forever run solely on the well worn but valuable wheels of our dear Mother Hope. And social service? It isn't only about "intervening through research, policy, community organizing, direct practice, and teaching on behalf of those afflicted with poverty or any real or perceived social injustices and violations of their human rights." But it's also about lighting up those dark lives with the lantern of Hope.

Blind Man's Game

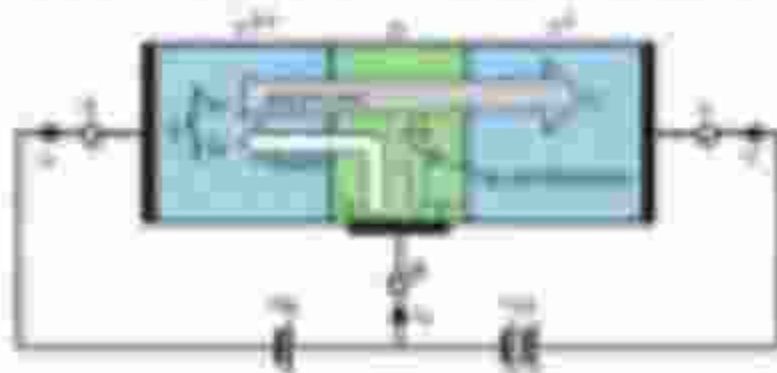

For example, given below is a basic schematic of a BJT(Bi-Polar Junction Transistor, it can be understood as a switch that controls larger current based on smaller currents). The current through Base (B) controls the flow of current through C(Collector)



If a mechanical engineer or an aeronautical engineer is analyzing a machine or an engine, he may predict what the machine or engine does by 'observing' its individual parts. But, while analyzing a circuit(take BJT circuit given below as an example), it's not at all possible to predict it's functionality using the above logic. Though I tried many times to analyze the circuit based on the function of individual components, but finally, if I need to know its overall behavior, then I need to use the prescribed equations of BJT and apply Kirchhoff's voltage and current equations and interpret the result based on the mathematical result obtained. (Maybe an intuitive feeling is developed by repeatedly solving such equations, but the point is we cannot even make a rough guess about the behaviour of the circuit without the support of mathematics)

It seems as if, the whole circuit is a black-box and we need a 'tool' called mathematics to act as a mirror for us to analyze the internal working.

If this is the case with electronics engineering, then one might be as well dumbstruck when he sees the way communication engineering is being done. Because, as mentioned earlier, communication engineering is the ability to send a message from one point to another using 'electromagnetic waves'.

Now, when I observed that, since it was not possible to feel the presence of the wave with any of the physical senses, I was very curious as how people were making a living in this field. Of course, based on my experience with this course, dealing with a myriad of mathematical equations, I can immediately deduce mathematics as an answer.

Even when mathematical models are created, they are used as mere tools based on what we feel through our physical senses, but I observed that the communication theory entirely depends on the mathematics. For example, a sound engineer makes mathematical models for his audio system based on what sound he is supposed to 'hear'; a civil engineer decides the reliability of the building foundation based on 'hardness', and then depends upon the mathematical models to measure the level of hardness. But a communication engineer mainly works on the mathematical parameters i.e., calculates how good the signal is, during transmission and reception (Signal-to-Noise Ratio or SNR), **calculates** the error involved during the transmission -this opens the gateway to a whole new subject called, Information Theory which is purely mathematical. The funny part is even the atmospheric behavior (usually termed as channel) are tried to frame down into equations [I do sometimes wonder how 'my' behavior can be modeled into equations].

Now that we have asked so many questions, we might as well ask one final one (the crucial one)- Is mathematics to be blamed for eliminating the 'aesthetics' of the subject? The answer- No! Because on a closer observation we can see that communication engineering (and also electronics engineering) is a subject in itself that deals with something 'beyond the reach of our senses' and mathematics is the tool which makes it possible for us to be within the reach of the subject.

The bottom line - Mathematics is THE light for us (electronics and communication engineers in particular) to move forward. Electronics and Communication engineering is indeed a blind man's game after all!

Now the question arises as to how can a girl like me lead a life without fear for the next sixty years if some people are so profane? There is just one wish of mine, and I'm sure it is the wish of every woman on Earth – to make such men understand that women are a symbol of love, patience and reverence, and should not be seen as an object of pleasure. The day this happens, there will be Heaven on Earth.

बुनियादी पड़ाव

नृत्य ही जीवन है इस बात को अगस्तस फिब के अलेख के माध्यम से कभी जानने और कभी हीरे तबले नचाने द्वारा ज्ञान है। कहते हैं की यह नृत्य शास्त्र है और सभी नृत्य कलाओं की उपज यही ही है।

यहाँ वह सज्जना हो जो कहे की ये आन्दोलनकारी अथवा क्रान्तिकारी स्थिति से अवगत नहीं, व्यापारी ज्ञानता है कि व्यवहारिक जीवन में नैतिकता का स्थान केवल सदियों तथा आज्ञाओं में होता है, एक ज्ञानता स्त्री न समझे जाने पर सही को प्रीति बनाती या बनाता है, बच्चे बड़े को न समझे जाने पर दोषी बनार देते हैं, ये सब एक ही बात की ओर इंगित करते हैं जीवन में ताल अथवा नृत्य की कमी है। क्या यह संभव है? क्या इस धर्म का विस्तार संभव है? क्या इन प्रश्नों का कोई उत्तर है?

योगिक दर्शन में यह माना जाता है कि जो कुछ हमें अपनी आँखों से दिखता है वह केवल अन्तर्निहित संसार की परछाई मात्र है, और योजी बाहर की समस्याओं का सामना अपने अन्दर ही प्रयत्न तथा प्रखंड साधना के उन अकृष्ट क्षणों में ही कर दर्शन कर करते रहे हैं।

क्या इस सारते अपने अन्दर होने वाले दुर्बल्य का भी समाधान देखा जा सकता है जो कहीं के जीवन में नैराश्य अथवा एक विकृत मोहमायता का कारण बन जाती है?

योग के अनुसार प्राण मन को नियंत्रित करता है, नाद प्राण को नियंत्रित करता है। नाद वह ध्वनि के स्वरूप में व्यक्त किया गया ताल है। यही वह स्वर है जो प्राण के भिन्न भिन्न स्वरूपों को जन्म देता है। साधारण समझ के लिए प्राण वह व्यक्ति है जो व्यक्ति या जीव की अवस्था को निर्धारित करती है। जब व्यक्ति श्वास लेता है तो प्राण ही स्थित प्राण क्रियाविधि ही उत्पन्न है और जब व्यक्ति श्वास छोड़ता है तो प्राण के नीचे के भाग में स्थित अपान क्रियाविधि ही उत्पन्न है। जब व्यक्ति श्वास के कुन्दाक का आभास करता है तो प्राण में सम्मान वायु क्रियाविधि ही आती है और पूरे ताले प्रणाली का सुदृढिकरण होता है और यह जीव के स्वास्थ्य तथा अव्यतिर शक्ति का निर्धारण करता है। सम्मान का उत्सर्जन पूर्णता की स्थिति है जो अन्तर्निहित शक्तियों को मुक्त करती है जो जीवन में भिन्न भिन्न स्वरूपों में प्रकट होती है।

यह आवश्यक है की प्राण अपने कार्य को स्वल्पा स्वरूप से निभाता रहे और इससे अपना अपने कार्य को समत रूप से कार्य करने के लिए पेरित करता है। जब स्थितिया सामने आती है अथवा योग विज्ञान के जानकार आवश्यकता समझते है प्राण और अपान का वेग कुम्भक द्वारा रोकता जाता है, जिससे समान ध्यस्त हो शरीर के कार्य में एक नया तेज प्रदान करता है जिसका प्रभाव जीवन के विन्त विन्त कार्यकलापों में अपना प्रभाव दिख देता है।

“यह समान किस प्रकार जीवन में एक लय लाता है?”

“शुद्धता द्वारा”

“क्या इसका अर्थ है की जिनके जीवन में यह भेद, यह दूरी है उनमें अशुद्धता है?”

“चौथा कभी अशुद्ध नहीं होती। यह तो शास्त्री का उपदेश है कि हम सत्-चित्त-आनन्द-स्वरूप हैं।”

हम उन्में ही श्रद्धा करता अशुद्ध है जितना की संगी मर्या हो सकती है, यह तो उनकी शुद्धता है जो उन्हें पवित्र और मुक्तता बनाती है। अशुद्धताएँ जो हमसे डालती जाती रही है, कहीं कहीं तो इतना ज्यादा कि उस क्षेत्र से गुजरने वाली नदी के भाग को तो सूत घीमिद करना पड़ जाता है फिर भी इससे नदी पर कोई प्राण नहीं आती और लोग उसे वर्ष प्रतिवर्ष उसे उरसा और श्रद्धा के साथ आगमन और स्नान कर लाभ उठाते है तथा नदी भी उसी वेग के साथ समुद्र में बहती चली जाती रही है, हमारे पापों, कर्मों तथा अज्ञानित जीवन के परिणामों को घोंती हुई। उसी प्रकार से जैसे आत्मा अपनी जीवन यात्रा में यत्न प्रयत्न सहो निर्णयों से अभ्यासित हुई उनके प्रभावों और परिणामों को घोंती हुई वहन सभी सागर में समा जाती है।

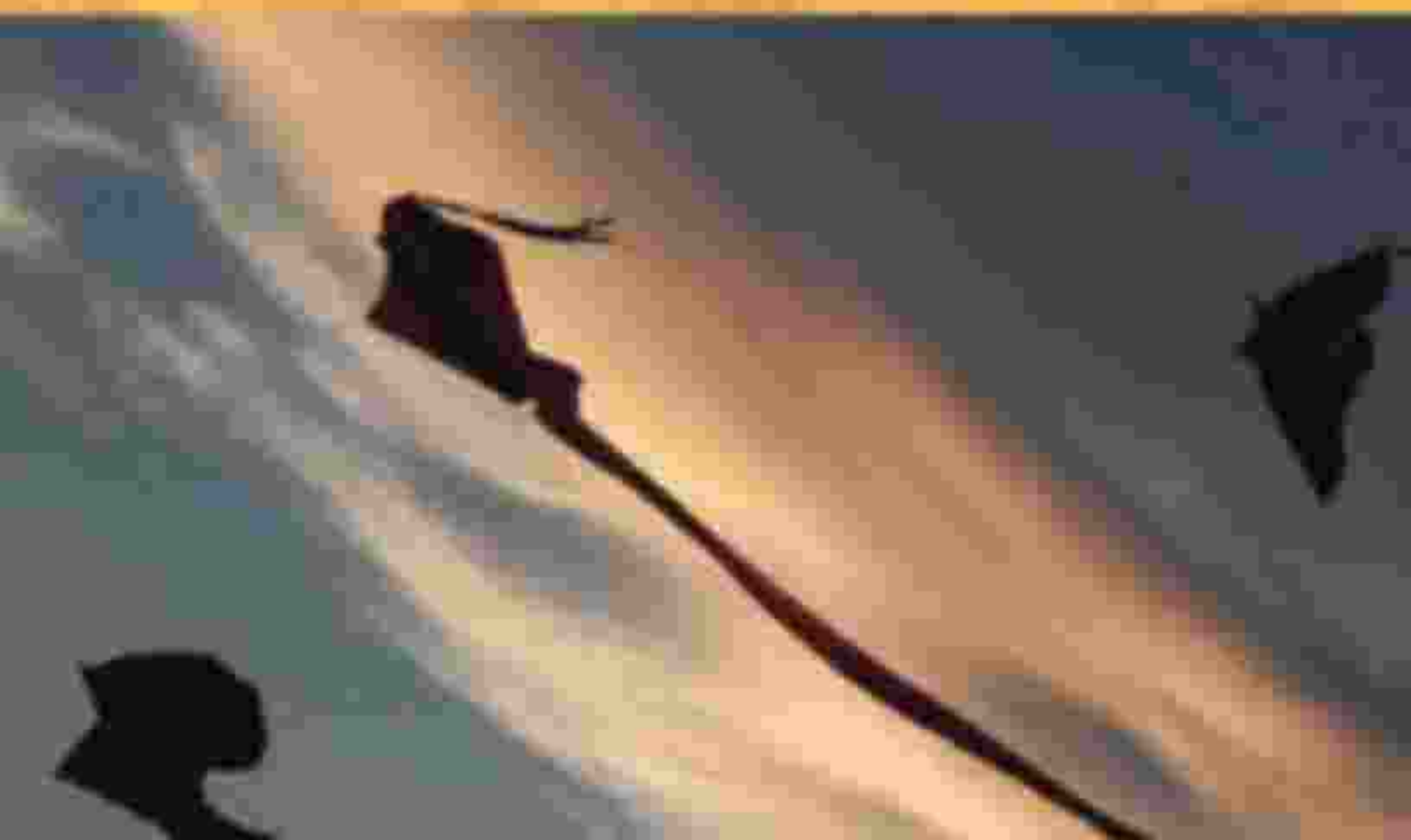

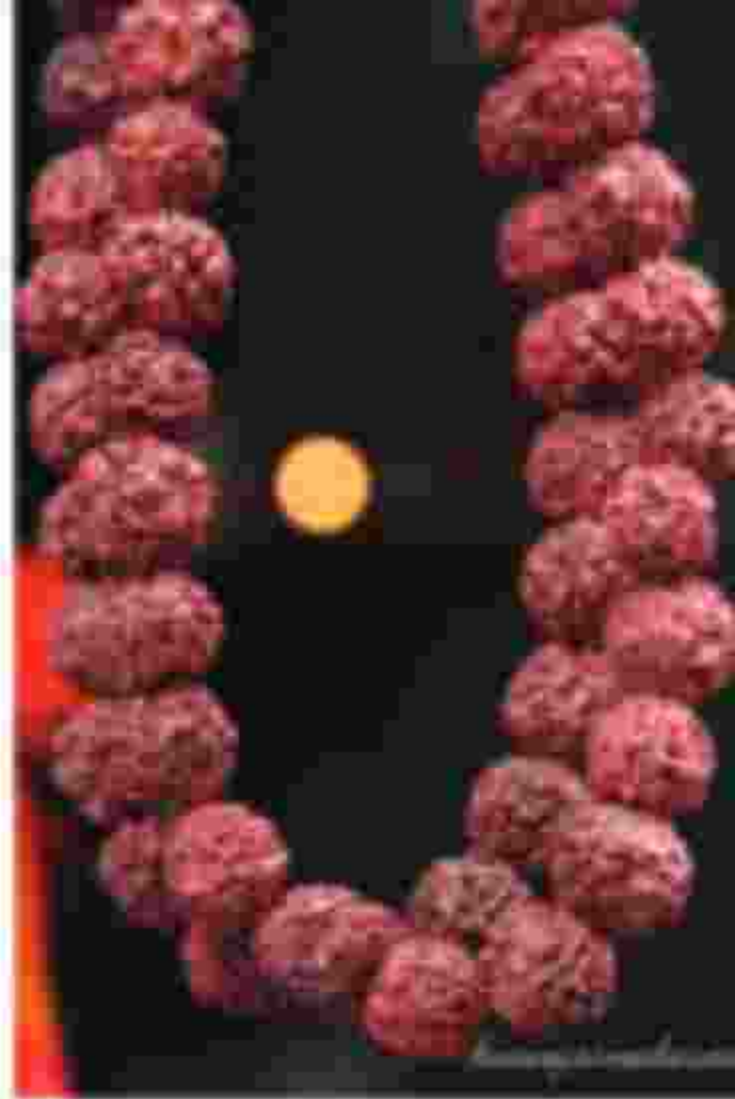

Yashodhara began her journey in writing in 2006 with her blog - youarefthnot.blogspot.com, described as a serious attempt to take life less seriously. "Just Married, Please Excuse" is her first book.

Dhwani's Karthik Margabandhu caught up with her for a brief interview...

Karthik: To start off things, I happened to have glanced at this book when I was buying something at flipkart and the title amused me and it made me wonder what the book was about. I happened to ask around and finally got hold of it and read it. I wanted to know more about the author and that's when I happened to come across your profile and I found it to be quite interesting. What do you actually do for your living?

YL: Well, I'm a marketing professional, currently with the Hindustan Times Group. I've handled all forms of marketing, from Traditional Media to Online Marketing and was recently the Business Head for a Movie Review portal called Desimartini, before I went on a sabbatical for few months.

Karthik: Marketing means quite a work load. Now that you are a mother of three, don't you find it a bit difficult to manage? How do you cope up with the dual identities?

YL: It's definitely not easy! I'm not just working and a mother of three, which is tough enough by itself, but I also have writing ambitions - my first novel was published in August 2012 by HarperCollins, and the second one, which I'm finishing now, will be out in 2013. I think I was trying to juggle too many balls, and was afraid of dropping something, so I decided to take my sabbatical - it was necessary for me to step back, take stock, reprioritize - I have spent more time with my family over the last few months, and it's brought a lot more clarity to my life.



Karthik: You are an active blogger too. I always find your blog being flooded with posts and you seem to find time to update it regularly. What made you incline towards blogging?

YL: Well, my blog may be flooded with posts, but I've been blogging since 2006! I try to blog regularly, but I don't think I'm able to be all that frequent these days. I don't know what initially made me get into blogging – perhaps it was the long-suppressed desire to just write something. But the blog ended up being very useful in various ways. In fact, now with Indiblogger and HarperCollins, I'm mentoring something called the 'Get Published' contest, wherein bloggers get to submit short stories which could end up in a HarperCollins book. The details are on the microsite indiblogger.in/getpublished/ I personally feel I owe a lot to blogging, and would love to help other bloggers achieve their dream to get published too.

Karthik: As a marketing professional, how did the transition to an author of two books happen?

YL: I haven't really transitioned – I plan to go back to the world of Marketing. The first book just sort of got written on my maternity leave in 2010 – I had my twins after a complicated surgery, and realized that life is short, so it makes sense to work at your dreams as quickly as possible. The second book was finished during this sabbatical. I intend to keep writing, but don't think I shall ever do it full-time. It's not my day job.

Karthik: As I told you before, "Just Married, Please Excuse", the name really caught my attention. It's rather an odd or a unique name to come up with. Could you please elucidate us on the novel?

YL: This book is about the story of the early years of marriage between a hot-tempered Delhi girl and her laid-back husband. It's unabashedly autobiographical – I haven't even bothered to change the names of most characters because they are members of my family, and I'm assuming they won't sue me. The book is basically a hilarious take, and tells a story which a lot of people say they can relate to. It's going into a reprint already, within just a few months of launch – so it's been received very well. I'm glad – I like the thought of making so many people laugh!

Karthik: There are a lot of bloggers/writers these days. People write about anything and everything they could think of or relate to. Seeing that you are quite an author and a professional in the field of blogging and writing, what suggestions do you give to the young minds out there?

YL: I don't consider myself a professional in writing – I'm just one and a half-books old right now. But I do want to tell the 'young minds' out there – please explore various things – you may find a combination of things that works for you. There are no set answers, you have to find your way yourself. And that's what makes life exciting. Please believe in yourselves and your own unique talents – just try not to put off your dreams for too long.

Karthik: So will there be a sequel or another book anytime soon?

YL: The second book is the story of a divorced man trying to figure out life. It will be out in August or September 2013. The sequel to *Just Married, Please Excuse* will be out perhaps in 2014 – if I manage to write it later this year. The tentative name for the third book (the unwritten sequel) is 'Still Married, Thank You.'

And I'm still looking for a good name for the second book, out later this year! Hopefully, you'll hear of it soon.



A Start With FINISH



Vijay.S.Athreye cofounded the FINISH program in the year 2009 and has been assisting in its implementation ever since as a member of the Program Management Board.

Karthik: *To start off things, I read your profile to find mind boggling achievements. Could you tell me the motto behind FINISH, as to the reason why it was started?*

Vijay Athreye: Finish began as an engagement strategy with the implementing partners of TATA AIG Micro life insurance program. I felt TATA AIG could develop more insurance products where habit change to hygienic practices like sanitation could be incentivised through health micro insurance products which would mean up selling opportunity for TATA AIG with lowered risks of claims. At the same time implementing partners of TATA AIG (NGO's /MFI's) would have two additional streams of income for their organisation in distributing health insurance products and in assisting their target market with sanitation loans and in construction of safe household toilets.

Karthik: *But Sir, Didn't you study Engineering? What made you pursue Management?*

Vijay Athreya: Even I wonder why! I guess I studied Chemical Engineering but became a Cornical Engineer so thought I could correct that with management! Actually most people in our generation Shobhana, Deepak all pursued engineering with management degrees. I guess that's what most of us end up doing. Don't know why?

Karthik: *You are right. Management after Engineering has become the order of the day. Coming back to FINISH, Does the acronym have any deeper meaning?*

Vijay Athreya: Financial INclusion Improves Sanitation and Health, that's what FINISH stands for. What we are trying in FINISH is to bring aspects of microcredit and micro insurance(financial inclusion),to improve sanitation so that the outcome is health improvement.

Karthik: *That's really a catchy name for a purposeful cause. But you have held business development, marketing and strategic consulting assignments both in the middle east and in India for over 19 years, what made you incline towards FINISH all of a sudden?*


Vijay Athreya: The thought of impacting lots of people.

Karthik: *That's really thoughtful. Apart from spreading awareness about sanitation, You are also a speaker at various national and international conferences on issues of sustainable development. Could you elucidate us on one such conference which is close to your heart?*

Vijay Athreya: The one at Munich in 2005 November organised by Munich Re Foundation. This is where I presented my first ever case study on good and bad practices of Micro insurance which I had co-authored with Jim Roth. I represented TATA AIG at this conference and our program in India suddenly gained a wide acceptance by the Indian, Chinese, and Tanzanian regulators for insurance thereafter.

Karthik: *It's really nice to see you give a lot of importance to cause. Where do you see yourself and FINISH 10 years from now?*

Vijay Athreya: I see myself as an old man. FINISH is still not FINISHED. It will take a while before India gets fully covered with good sanitation. So till then we will not stop working.

Set in the magnificent Olympic standard swimming pool of Amrita, standing tall, a little over six feet, braving the scorching sun, amidst chirping enthusiastic swimmers, you observe Akhilesh Matti Rajakyla has just 'swimming' on his mind, however culminating the training session with a humble prayer of 'Lokah Samastah Sukhino Bhavantu', one is instantly forced to observe another side to him. Shedding light on both aspects and plenty in between, Akhilesh played



good sport to every query my mind spewed:

Q: Starting off with the most obvious query in our Indian minds... The unique pronunciation of your name and a little about your Finnish background...

A: My name, Akhilesh Matti Rajakyla, Akhilesh is the name given by Amma and Matti Rajakyla is my

Finnish name (here he explains Matti (pronounce: like the Malayalam word for the Sardine fish), Rajakyla (pronounce: Rayakila)). In Finland, I attended Mäkelänrinne (ma-kelän-riñ-né) Sports High School and graduated in the year 2004.

Q: Could you tell us more about your school, your experiences leading unto there and beyond...

A: Being quite an athletic child, my father enrolled me for swimming lessons, where I wasn't quite the performer, however my increased hours of training, my ever supportive coach and positive drive from my peer group at High School paved way to my professional swimming career. My career saw an exponential growth during this period. At the age of 16 I was in

Q: Speaking of The Athens Olympics, 2004, which set you apart as an Olympian Swimmer, what were the highlights of being a part of the world's greatest sporting event?

A: I was just 20 at that time and the whole idea was fun and games to me. The experience was unreal and I was privileged to witness sport stars from every field (recollects: NBA stars, Usain Bolt, Maurice Green...). You know the whole world is watching your every move, even then, I felt no pressure and in fact we gave a decent performance (finished 14th in the medley relay (4x100m)).

From 2005, I started developing as a swimmer and things began to take a serious turn. I realised the competitive reality of the sport at The Beijing Olympics, 2008, when I missed the 16th position by 0.2s, not making it to the top 8 by 0.5s and missing the medal by a second (the event was 50 meters Freestyle, where he secured the 29th position).

Q: Life post 2008?

A: By 2008 my outlook towards the game had moved to a serious level and the fun was lost. I realised that it was time for me to step back for a while and I remember telling the reporters back in Finland that I needed to fall in love with the sport.



The greatest athletes in the world have immense creative power (Tauko). They have the ability to use their body in a manner that goes to great heights and lengths. Don't think that hard work is the only way to success. Hard work of course is necessary, but it takes a lot of creativity to make the hard work fruitful. The best athletes in the world besides hard work, have found a unique way to put it into practice. They are not just aware of the movements of their body but also of their mind.



It was around this time when I first met Amma, in the year 2009 on one of her visits to Finland.

Q: Would you call this meeting a turning point in your life?

A: Until then, I'd been searching for something all through my life. In fact I had no idea about Indian traditions or anything in regard with meditation or spirituality.

This was when Amma imparted a very thought provoking message: "It's not about what you do but it's about how you do it." She lay emphasis on love and passion in whatever you do, only then can you enjoy every moment of your life. Henceforth I decided to learn more about Amma's teachings and moved to Amritapuri.

Q: So currently, would you call this period a break from professional swimming?

A: Not exactly, now I am not pursuing professional swimming, however I'm keeping my options open and I might just compete in the Olympics in my forties, you never know!..

"If you give a task to a top athlete, that he is really interested in, he dives into it and performs it in a magnificent way, and with utmost care. Working under pressure and stress is a piece of a cake for him. While he is performing, the whole country is watching. All eyes are on him. The pressure is tremendous!"

Q: Then narrowing down to short-term plans..

A: My short-term plan is to stay in India. Mostly I shuttle between Amritapuri and Finland. In Finland, I teach swimming and I'm also a seasonal lifeguard on the beach. But most of the year I spend in Amritapuri, where I try to learn Amma's valuable teachings in order to implement them in the real world.

Amma has talked about connecting the two worlds, meaning the East and West. I have always thought that these seemingly different cultures have a lot to offer for each other. The West is like the machine, and East, mostly I mean India, is the fuel. I am a big admirer of Indian tradition and culture and the connection between these two and the possibilities I see, what India can offer to the world is immense. Even in sports.

Q: Finally, a few thoughts to be shared among fellow Amritians...

A: As westerners in India, we come from a different culture; the reason why we come here is because there is so much value to be offered to the world. I always say that India is the heart and the rest of the world is all the other parts of the body. I would like the youth to uphold their traditional values and Amrita University is a wonderful place to show what the Indian culture truly stands for. I ask all the students to

Recently, Dr. Sethu was in the city for a conference conducted by the Computer Society of India. Siddarth & Megha caught up with the genius for a short

Megha: Good evening sir! It is a pleasure to do this interview and thank you so much for obliging to our request.

Dr.Sethu: It's my pleasure to share whatever possible knowledge I can with the future of our country.

Sid: I read your profile online and one thing hit me. From Delhi to Trichy to US and now UK, you've been exposed to different cultures and ways of learning throughout your life. How does this exposure help?

Dr Sethu Vijayakumar holds a Personal Chair in Robotics and is the Director of the Institute of Perception, Action & Behavior (IPAB) in the School of Informatics at the University of Edinburgh. Since 2007, he is the Microsoft/Royal Academy of Engineering Senior Research Fellow in Learning Robotics. He also holds additional appointments as an Adjunct Faculty of the University of Southern California (USC), Los Angeles, a Visiting Research Scientist at the ATR Computational Neuroscience Labs, Kyoto-Japan and the RIKEN Brain Science Institute, Tokyo. He has a Ph.D. ('98) in Computer Science and Engineering from the Tokyo Institute of Technology.

Dr Sethu: On an individual perspective, it has helped me make a difference in the society I presently live in. Adaptability is something which cannot be learnt but acquired and exposure helped me do that. You can be very good in a subject just sitting behind a table but when you change places, you have to adapt to a different way of thinking and living and this is the tricky part. For example, you can predict the stock markets in the US but not in Japan because of the contrasting cultures but if you're exposed to both worlds, the job becomes a walk in the park.

Megha: You're also into Optimization according to your profile and since you've mentioned the stock markets, may I ask how your field of study helps in predicting the stock markets? Rather, where do you come into the picture?

Dr Sethu: Well, patterns are there everywhere. We learnt to recognise patterns from Nature and this is an important aspect of predicting, recognising patterns. Also, my knowledge enables me to predict ranges and trends through methods like neural networks and genetic algorithms but not values. Values are specifically left out of prediction because if I can predict values then the world would want me right now. So, essentially predictions are predictions and they are never accurate but what we try to do is to identify patterns, ranges and trends and leave the values for markets to decide.



You should know that optimization also involves cross validation and my role come here where I use a certain set of data to arrive at a result and another set of data to validate this result. This helps me constantly tune the model.

Sid: Sir, moving a little towards your educational qualifications. In today's world, there is a constant dilemma amongst Indian Youth about the relevance of Work Experience before or after higher studies. Based on your life, what would you suggest is the better option?

Dr Sethu: Personally, I believe work ex matters only for Business Schools. From what I have seen in my life experience, leaving a gap year or working for a brief period before specializing doesn't always work out to your benefit. If you're passionate about a subject, especially if you're part of the engineering field, it is best to study at a stretch. At least, that's what I think would be best to be the best at what you do. One more important advice I would give to youngsters is this; pursue higher studies only if you're passionate about the subject and not just for the degree since obtaining a degree in today's world is nowhere close to being called a degree holder in that subject. So, follow your heart always.

Megha: I overheard someone mentioning you're a "Science Communicator". Could you elaborate on that title?

Dr Sethu: Well, through the years, I have specialised in Outreach, that is to take what I learn to the people. Recently, I organised an outreach program in Scotland, where we did a workshop on the Honda azimo robot. Also, we try to hold an Outreach program every Saturday and Sunday in the college campus for the benefit of our students. I believe in taking science to the people since it is

Sid: Sir, Simple question, which side would you choose- Innovation or invention?!

Dr. Sethu: A Generic fit all answer, depends on individuals. It always depends on what you're good at. If you're a person who's excited about new things then it should be invention and if you're someone who looks at tweaking things to fit your suitability then it's innovation. I personally am a diplomatic person by nature so I don't prefer to pick sides.

Sid: Well, there's always a talk on Going Green everywhere and since you've been exposed to so many cultures and practices around the world, what would you comment on the scenario in India?!

Dr Sethu: See, Going Green requires a lot of Innovation, research and investment. No immediate return is possible in this field and hence it requires brave investment strategies and that lacks in India. Out there, we have major money in this field, with all major companies investing on Sustainable Technology as this is the future. Solar is the way forward for India as major part of the country is exposed to a lot of Sunlight and hence, if our leaders decide to invest, then my bet would be in Solar Technology.

A positive thing which I've observed in India is that the Economics makes sense. There is this green tax in India which is encouraging and also Monetization scheme is pretty clear. Trade must be monitored and I can see India Going Green pretty soon.

Sid: Sir, my last question. When are you coming back home?!

Dr Sethu: Honestly, I have just started my career out there and my family is well settled. I wouldn't want to rush back just yet but I will be back when I am confident that I have the knowledge to make a Difference in my Mother Nation.

Megha: And my last question, as cliché as it may sound, a message for Amrita?

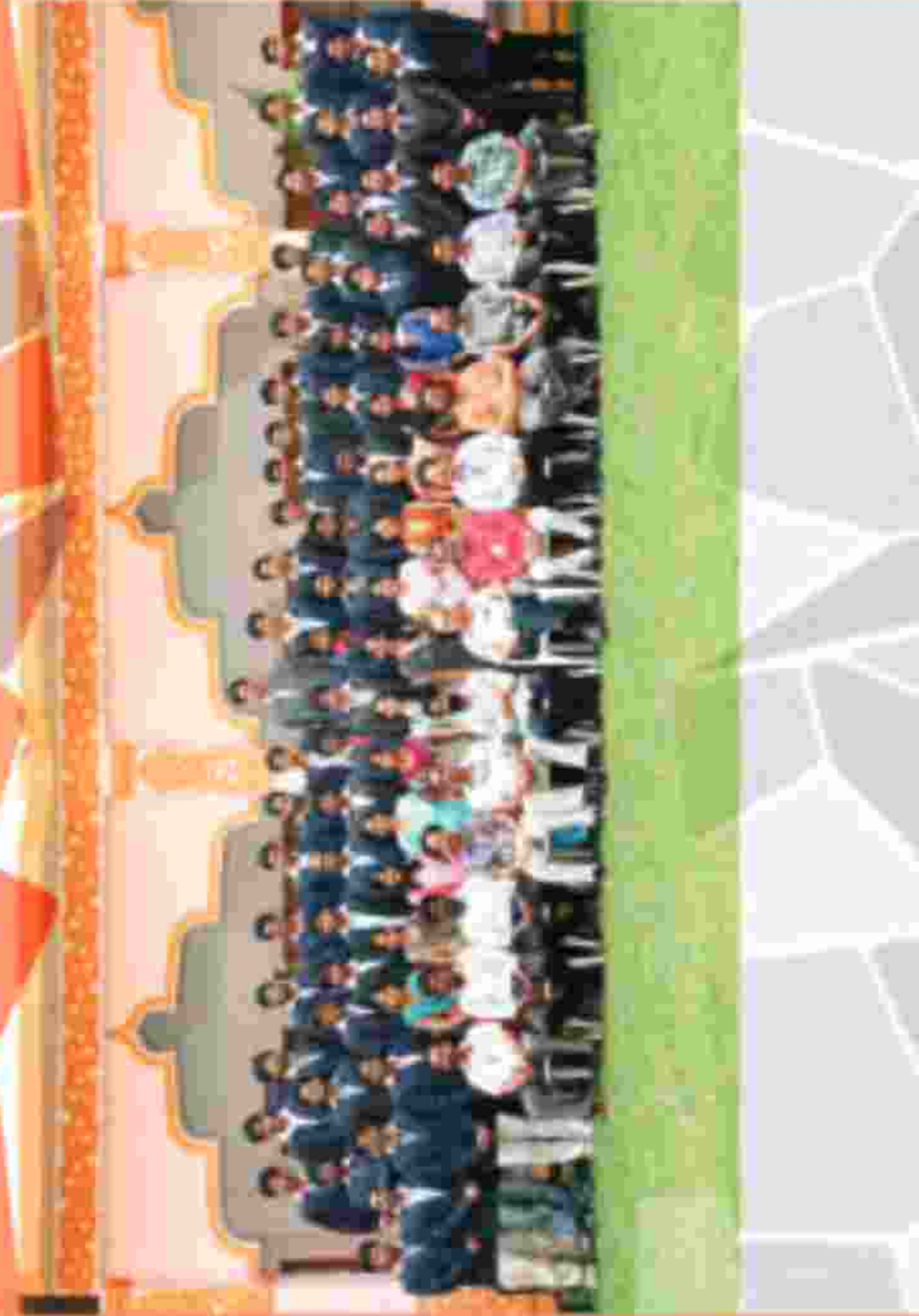
