Chancellor Amma appointed as Chair of GOI's civil society sector at G20 Leaders' Summit 2023

The Govt of India has appointed Chancellor Amma as the Chair of the Country's Civil 20 (C20), an official engagement group of the Group of 20 (G20). The G20 is the premier intergovernmental forum for the world's developed and emerging economies to address financial stability on a global basis. The C20 is its platform for civil society organizations (CSOs) to bring forth non-government and non-business voices to the G20 leaders.

Amma said: "In 2005, we created the AmritaSREE programme. Here, pooled money was given as grant funding from the Math. Through this, self-financing groups were created to aid in The start-up businesses and vocational training. These groups were not only able to make themselves self-reliant, but even made their entire villages so."

Today, AmritaSREE has helped seed 15,000 SHGs in 21 states across India and 2.5 lakh women have found a means to earn a living, with most of them living in villages and other isolated rural areas. During the pandemic, the Math also distributed COVID-19 aid packages to AmritaSREE members that consisted of financial assistance, grocery kits, and clothes. The amount of aid provided was ₹85 crore (\$11 million).

In concluding her address to India's C20 team, Amma added: "All the issues raised here are vitally important. However, this should go beyond a mere physical meeting and become a true meeting—a meeting of hearts and minds. This is the only way to awaken ourselves and others."

India Leveraging Geospatial Tech to Tackle Sustainability Challenges: **UNWGIC 2022**

With the theme of “Geo-Enabling the Global Village: No one should be left behind”, the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) has convened the Second United Nations World Geospatial Information Congress (UNWGIC) in Hyderabad, India from 10-14 October 2022.



For more than a decade, Esri has been at the forefront of assisting the United Nations and national governments in addressing the complex challenges of sustainable development. Supporting the sustainable development agenda, Esri India, the country’s leading Geographic Information System (GIS) Software & Solutions provider, showcased two critical initiatives namely – Bhu-Kaushal (Esri India-CSC Academy joint initiative for women empowerment and education) and Mera Gaav, Hamara Jal (Esri India - Amrita Vishwa Vidyalayam joint initiative for strengthening community resilience through Geospatial). The initiatives were showcased in the G-Chaupal, a platform that seeks to link village communities with geospatial services at UNWGIC-2022.
